The position will be classified according to personal qualifications up to pay grade 13 TV-L. This is a fixed-term position until 31 May 2029. Continued employment may be possible.

Funded by the EU-Horizon program, the collaborative research project 'Transformative Rotations for Adaptation and Sustainable Future, Outcome and Resilience Mapping (TRANSFORM)' combines inter- and transdisciplinary research approaches with the aim of developing suitable processes, tools and methods for innovations in crop rotation management by farmers as a nature-based solution for climate adaptation. Work package 6, led by the University of Vechta, is responsible for conducting acceptance research among farming practitioners and addresses questions of transferability of project developments to further EU regions. Ultimately, it has the aim of evaluating the extent to which the results developed in the project may lead to increased innovation capacity in the arable sector.

- Research on the acceptance of innovations in agricultural practice (from an environmental psychology perspective)
